

MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT TO 31 MARCH 2026

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the **Act**) and constitutes STATS Group's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 March 2026.

This statement applies to all STATS Group companies.¹

Who we are and what we do

STATS (UK) LTD (the **Company**) is the parent company of a group of companies operating across the world (the **Group**) providing pipeline isolation, hot tapping and line plugging equipment and services, principally to the energy sector.

Headquartered in the United Kingdom, the STATS Group has further entities and offices in Australia, Canada, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates and the United States of America. The Group has a global supply chain of vendors to support the manufacture, supply and delivery of the equipment and services to our clients.

In accordance with the Act and all applicable international laws, STATS Group is fully committed to ensuring that slavery and human trafficking does not take place in its business or in its supply chain.

STATS Group has taken action to mitigate the risk of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain, including those set out in this statement.

Policies

Our Anti-Slavery & Human Trafficking Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chain.

Agreements with our vendors

Our general purchase terms and conditions require our suppliers to comply with all applicable laws and regulations. In addition, our suppliers are expected to comply with the principles contained in our Code of Conduct.

Due diligence

STATS Group performs due diligence on suppliers prior to their inclusion on our approval vendors list. Where necessary and appropriate, we will conduct onsite supplier audits in order to verify the compliance of our supply chain with our agreed contracts, all applicable laws and our Code of Conduct. Where audit findings raise the need for corrective action, we work closely with our suppliers to support such a requirement.
